



As you get started with Canvas, utilize this guide to help you make the most of using Panopto within Canvas. With Panopto you can easily create, host, search, and share videos with your courses.



Enabling Panopto in a Canvas Course

Log in to Canvas and access your course.

<p>1. In your Canvas course, open the Settings area. This can be found at the bottom of the left navigation menu. If it is not open, click on the three lines next to the name of the course: </p>	
<p>2. Open the Navigation tab at the top of the page (Between Sections and Apps). Find the Panopto Video menu item in the bottom section of the page and drag it up into the top section so it will be enabled in the course menu.</p> <p>Save your changes using the button at the bottom of the page.</p>	

Add Recordings to Panopto

<p>1. Open the Panopto Video link found in the course menu.</p>	
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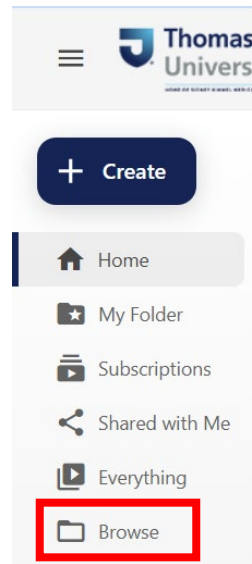
<p>2. Click the Create button at the top of the page.</p>	
<p>3. Choose a video to use:</p> <p>Select “Panopto for Windows” to use Panopto software to record from your device. Phrasing will be different if you are a Mac user.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Guide for Installation Guide for How to Record <p style="text-align: center;">-OR-</p> <p>Select “Panopto Capture” to record without downloading any software.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Available when using Google Chrome, Firefox, or Microsoft Edge as your browser. Guide for How to Record <p style="text-align: center;">-OR-</p> <p>Select “Upload Media” to choose media from your computer.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Click ‘Drag video or audio files here (or click to find on your computer)’ to browse your computer for files. Click Open/Select to choose the file. Continue to upload additional files or close the Upload window. The video may take a little time to process. 	

Copy Recordings from a Past Course into Canvas

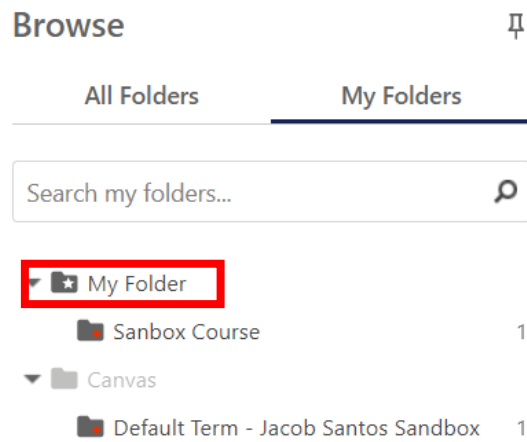
➤ Note: You must be an Instructor/Teacher in both courses.

| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Go to https://jefferson.hosted.panopto.com/ and log in. |

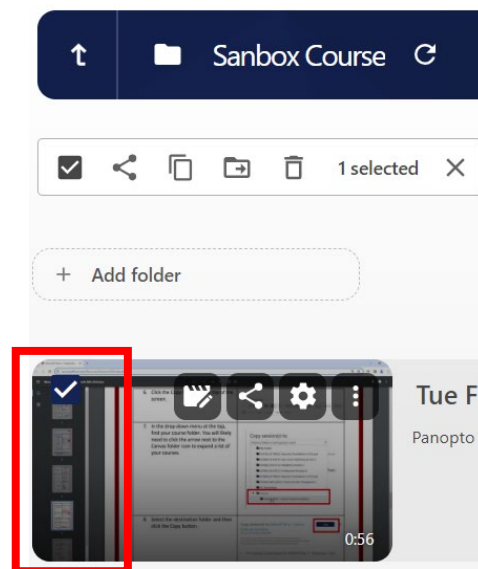
3. Use the Browse button on the left to find the course folder where your recordings are stored.






4. Select the "My folders" tab and click the appropriate course folder.








5. Hover your mouse over the video thumbnails to view a checkbox for each one. Click on the checkboxes to select the videos you want to copy.



<p>6. Click the Copy button at the top of the screen.</p>	
<p>7. In the drop-down menu at the top, find your course folder. You will likely need to click the arrow next to the Canvas folder icon to expand a list of your courses.</p>	
<p>8. Select the destination folder and then click the Copy button.</p>	

Adding Panopto Recordings to Modules in Canvas

<p>1. Return to your Canvas course. From the Modules page, find the Module where you want to add a recording.</p> <p>2. Use the + button in the upper right corner to add a new item to the Module.</p>	
<p>3. In the drop-down menu, select External Tool as the type of item to add.</p>	

<p>4. In the External Tools list, scroll down, find Panopto Video, and click on it to select it.</p> <p>5. <p>6. Select the video you want to add. Some video embed options can be opened at the bottom of the window which you can edit; they are probably fine to just leave alone. You'll see the list of External Tools again; if you want to give the recording a new title that will appear in the Module (e.g. Week 1 Lecture), you can type that title into the Page Name box.</p> <p>8.
